



Pupil premium 2016 -2017

All schools receive a grant from the government for each child who is eligible for free school meals, who have been looked after for more than six months or who have parents in the armed forces. This grant is known as the pupil premium. The pupil premium allocated to Whybridge Infant School for 2016 -2017 was £38,860 a decrease of £9,980 on the previous year due to fewer pupils in the school being eligible for the funding.

For the academic year 2016 -2017 the governing body decided to use the grant to provide additional individual or group support to pupils through additional learning support assistants and resources. The main focus of the support was to raise achievement in reading, writing and mathematics. Activities included precision reading, speech and language activities such as running the Talking Partners programme and Talking Maths programme and various intervention groups to support these pupils.

Impact of the pupil premium pupils.

Year 2 pupil premium = 13 pupils

Reading

4 of the 13 pupils did not meet the expected standard. Of the 46 non- pupil premium pupils 5 did not meet the standard.

Writing

4 of the 13 pupils did not meet the expected standard. Of the 46 non pupil premium pupils 5 did not meet the standard.

Maths

4 of the 13 pupils did not meet the expected standard. Of the 46 non pupil premium pupils 5 did not meet the standard.

Science

4 of the 13 pupils did not meet the expected standard. Of the 46 non pupil premium pupils 4 did not meet the standard.

Year 1 pupil premium = 8 pupils

Year 1 Phonic test:

Of the 8 pupil premium pupils all 8 passed the phonic assessment. This is above the national average.

Reading: At the end of year 1, 2 pupils were below expected standard.

Writing: At the end of year 1, 3 pupils were below expected standard.

Maths: At the end of year 1, 2 pupils were working below expected standard.

EYFS pupil premium = 10 pupils

Reading: 4 of the 10 pupils are working below expected standard.

Writing: 4 of the 10 pupils are working below expected standard.

Numbers: 4 of the 10 pupils are working below expected standard.

4 pupils did not achieve a good level of development.

Pupil Premium 2017-2018

The pupil premium for 2017 – 2018 is £40,920 an increase on the previous year by £2,060 and will be spent in a similar way by providing additional learning support assistants to run support programmes in literacy and mathematics to individuals and groups and to purchase resources.
