

An outline of this term's curriculum is described here for your information which we hope you will find of interest. The Summer term's work will be based on the theme of 'The Lighthouse keeper's lunch'. The children will investigate the importance of a balanced diet and how to keep healthy.

English

The children will be expected to write independently in a variety of genres including letters, book reviews, reports, stories and information writing. They will focus on writing different types of sentences, the use of conjunctions, contractions and the correct use of the past and present tense.

Maths

The children will practise oral and mental skills daily.

They will learn to add solve problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Through practical activities the children will measure length, weight, time and capacity. They will collect and present data in various forms e.g. pictogram, tally chart, block graph. The children will solve problems involving money in real life situations. They will learn to recall the 2, 5 and 10 times table.



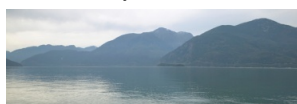
Science

The children will develop their scientific skills when learning about healthy living. This will include planning a healthy diet and understanding the importance of exercise.



Geography

This term the children will learn about geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the UK and a small area of a contrasting non-European country.



History

This term the children will develop their historical skills of enquiry by learning about the lives of famous people from the past and how they have contributed to national and international achievements. They will learn to make comparisons with how people lived in the past and make comparisons with how we live today. They will use a range of resources and artefacts to learn about the past.



Art

The famous artists Georgia O'Keefe, Anthony Gormley and Henry Moore will be studied this term and the children will create drawings and 3D models in the style of these artists.

Music

The children will have the opportunity to use a selection of instruments to accompany new songs. They will learn to create different melodic patterns using their voices and instruments.



Design and Technology

The children will develop their knowledge of structures by exploring different types of lunchboxes and then will design and make their own lunchbox and as part of the new cooking curriculum the children will learn to make a seasonal salad.

ICT

Once again this term the children will have the opportunity to use our extensive range of ICT equipment to support other curriculum areas and develop specific ICT skills. This term the main focus will be on creating an iMovie linked to healthy living and exercise, using 2Code to complete coding and debugging challenges and continuing to learn how to use technology safely.



Physical Education

In gymnastics the children will develop a range of movements and learn how to link these together. They will participate in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

Religious Education



This term the children will learn about why churches and mosques are important to believers.

Personal, Social, Health Education and Citizenship

The children will develop their understanding of the importance rules play in keeping themselves safe. They are also taught to respect that different people have different beliefs and celebrations. The school council will continue to be a voice for the children.

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
